The Curriculum adopted by the Department for the various part time language courses in Bulgarian, Czech, Croatian, Hungarian and Polish is in accordance with the common European Framework of references for languages (CEFR). This is incorporated into three papers: Communicative Grammar (LEVEL - A1 (Beginner) A2 - (Elementary), Translation and Written Comprehension and Spoken (oral expression) so that the needs for acquiring basic skills in FLT are addressed sufficiently. The curriculum for the one year Full Time Intensive Course in Russian and Bulgarian allows the students to attain an appropriate level of the language, whereby they can independently express themselves on activities of daily life in written form as well as orally. Short courses on theoretical literary and grammatical concepts equip them for further philological studies. The curriculum for M. A. in Russian studies is designed for the students to attain an advanced level in Russian philology equipping them to branch out into the field of academics (teachers, researchers) or professional translation.
